L. Faith and Community Enrichment

In the spirit of gratitude and joy, we reflect on recent milestones that mark significant moments in the life of our diocesan family. These events not only strengthen our faith but also reinforce the bonds of our community, as we witness God's hand at work among us.

1. THE NORTH EAST INDIA REGIONAL PASTORAL CONFERENCE

The North East India Regional Pastoral Conference held from August 26th to 29th, 2024, at the North East Diocesan Social Forum in Guwahati, marking an important event for the Church in our region. This year's conference, cantered on the theme "Evangelization in North East by revisiting Ecclesia in Asia," served as a crucial platform to discuss and enrich the ways of spreading the Gospel and addressed significant sociopolitical issues that impact our society and faith communities.

Representing our diocese were Rev. Fr. CD Mathai SDB, Secretary for Evangelization, and Rev. Fr. Thomas Lakra, President of the Diocese Fraternity of Itanagar, alongside myself. Keynote speaker Rev. Fr. Dr. Kuriakose Poovathumkudy reminded every baptized person of their calling to disseminate the essence of the Gospel, defining us all as the "aroma of Christ" in accordance with 2 Cor 2:14-15.

Mr. Manoj Sunny, Secretary for Evangelization of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC), briefly articulated the dual pillars of evangelization: Proclamation (*Kerygma*) and Community (*Koinonia*), which form the bedrock of our mission to preach and demonstrate Christ's salvific message and enduring love in unity.

The conference emphasized the need for continuous reflection on our dedication to the mission of evangelization. It urged us to transcend mere functionality and embody the true spirit of missionary discipleship.

Let us carry forward the insights and commitments from this conference as we passionately live out our call to evangelize, and may we be ever renewed in faith, inspired by the brotherhood and youth care discussions, and the living examples of small Christian communities.

2. JOURNEYING TOGETHER IN THE 2025 ORDINARY JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

The Universal Church is preparing to step into the holy season of grace, the Ordinary Jubilee Year of 2025, themed "Pilgrims of Hope." Beginning in Advent 2024 and culminating on January 6, 2026, the Jubilee Year presents an opportunity for the Church worldwide to foster hope amidst global challenges such as war, the COVID-19 pandemic, and climate change.

The Jubilee Year celebrations will be inaugurated by His Holiness Pope Francis, with the ceremonial opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Signifying a portal of mercy and redemption, the Holy Doors, which open exclusively during a Jubilee Year, invite the faithful to pass through in a spirit of repentance and renewal.

In the Catholic Church, an indulgence is a remission of the temporal punishment due to sin, granted by the Church through the authority of the Pope and bishops. It is not a forgiveness of the sin itself, but rather a reduction or elimination of the penalty associated with the sin.

There are two types of indulgences:

- 1. Partial indulgence: Reduces the temporal punishment due to sin.
- 2. Plenary indulgence: Completely eliminates the temporal punishment due to sin.

To receive an indulgence, certain conditions must be met:

- 1. Sacramental confession
- 2. Eucharistic communion
- 3. Prayer for the Pope's intentions
- 4. Freedom from attachment to sin

Indulgences can be obtained through various means, such as:

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Pilgrimages
- 3. Charitable works
- 4. Participation in certain liturgical events
- 5. Devotions

The faithful of our diocese, as pilgrims of hope, will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence granted by the Holy Father by visiting anyone of the following designated churches in the Diocese of Itanagar:

- a) St. Joseph Cathedral, Nyokum Lapang
- b) Holy Trinity Church, Banderdewa
- c) St. Joseph Church, Kaying

I am also happy to announce that Rev. Fr. Boniface, our Catechetical Commission Secretary, has attended an important meeting regarding the Jubilee Year. He will visit your parishes or deaneries to enlighten and encourage you about the significance of the Jubilee.

May this Jubilee Year unite us as we step forward in faith, hope, and the shared purpose of our Christian calling.

3. VIANNEY DAY: HONOURING THE PATRON SAINT OF PRIESTS

On the joyful occasion of the feast of Saint Jean-Marie Vianney, we, the diocesan priests, came together at St. Patrick's Seminary for a day filled with reflection, recollection, and spiritual celebration. In 1994, St. Thomas Church community in Mechuka was established with the presence of just two people, with the intervention of Bro. Prem Bhai. I wish to thank the MSFS Fathers for evangelizing this area and providing pastoral care to the people from 1994 to 2018. On September 25, 2018, St. Thomas Catholic Church

in Mechuka was raised to the status of a full-fledged parish by my predecessor, Bishop Emeritus John Thomas, who appointed Fr. Sabu Joseph as the first parish priest.

Today, Mechuka has grown with 127 Catholic families in Mechuka town and another 28 Catholic families in four surrounding villages. The collective efforts of the community and well-wishers have resulted in the creation of a breathtakingly beautiful church, a true sanctuary of worship and devotion.

Let us continue to come together to pray, worship, and serve. May this church be a catalyst for spiritual growth, community building, and outreach to those in need. Congratulations once again on this remarkable accomplishment! May God bless and prosper us as we continue to build His kingdom together.

The solemn ceremony, held at St. Joseph's Cathedral, Mantripukhri, Imphal, marks a joyous occasion for the Church. The pallium, a distinctive ecclesiastical vestment, symbolizes the Archbishop's authority as well as the special bond of ecclesiastical communion with the See of Peter.

This honour manifests the unity of our Church and the shepherding mission entrusted to our bishops. We join in congratulating Archbishop Linus Neli, wishing him God's abundant blessings as he continues to guide the faithful with pastoral care and love.

Here are some key points about the Pallium and its importance:

- Origin: The origin of the Pallium is uncertain, but it has been used since the 4th century.
- **Design:** The Pallium is a white band of wool, worn around the neck, featuring two pendants and six black crosses.
- Bestowal: The Pallium is bestowed by the pope on metropolitan archbishops, symbolizing their jurisdictional authority.
- **Significance:** The Pallium represents the archbishop's unity with the pope and their role as a pastor and shepherd.
- Wearers: Only the pope, metropolitan archbishops within their archdiocese, and the Latin Rite Patriarch of Jerusalem are allowed to wear the Pallium.
- **Symbolism:** The Pallium symbolizes the Good Shepherd shouldering a lamb, representing the archbishop's role as a shepherd and pastor.
